

- Determine the tasks stakeholders want moving forward.

- Determine which type of model makes the most sense for Ferson-Otter Creek stakeholders.

Determine Tasks:

- Coordinate implementation activities among stakeholders.
- 2. Assist with coordinating funding and grant management.
- 3. Oversee data collection/ contractors.
- 4. Coordinate meetings.
- 5. Conduct education and outreach efforts on behalf of the watershed group.
